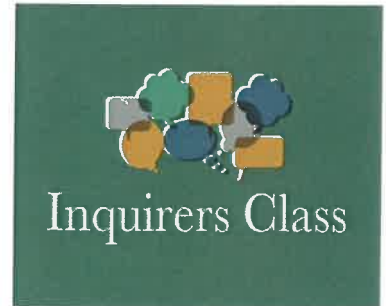

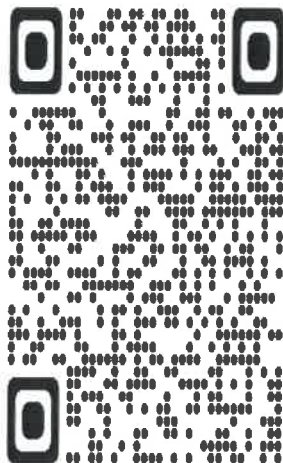

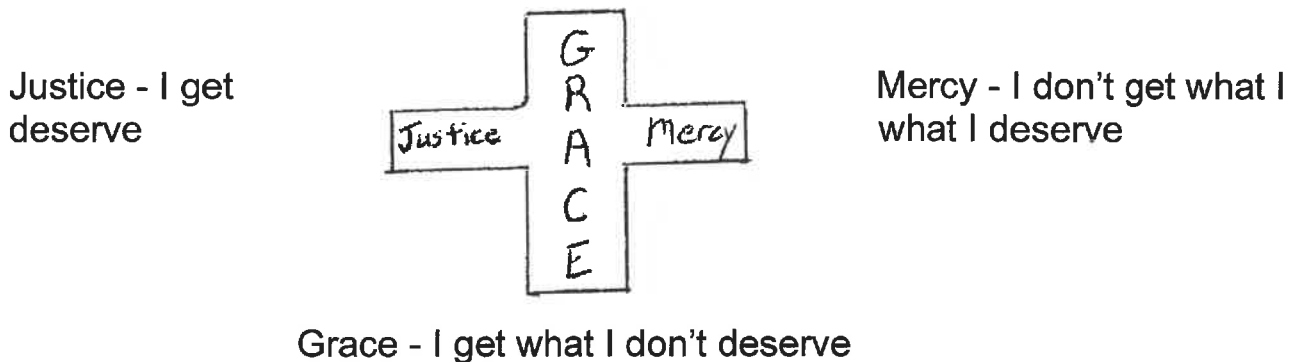

Dear Children of God,

One of my favorite classes in our Adult Inquirer's Class is on Grace. It's difficult for me to fathom the depth of His grace, which is one reason John Newton called it "Amazing Grace". Our new Music Director, Anne Bacon, had us sing this classic hymn in church a couple of Sundays ago.

One way to understand grace is to contrast it with Justice and Mercy, not as abstract concepts but as understood from my personal perspective, what I receive. How do justice, mercy and grace affect my personal life? A diagram:



My favorite illustration is **me speeding down Highway 174**. The Deputy Sheriff spots me, pulls me over and gives me a ticket. I received Justice, I got what I deserved. Another occasion, speeding down Highway 174. The Deputy Sheriff spots me, pulls me over and gives me a warning. I received Mercy, I didn't get what I deserved. Another occasion, speeding down Highway 174. The Deputy Sheriff spots me, pulls me over and hands me a check for \$10,000! I received Grace, I got what I didn't deserve! Ha!

Wey, that's crazy! Exactly! That's how crazy and amazing His grace is! Some of us hear about it in church over and over so we have become accustomed to His grace. We take it for granted, we don't think about it so much.

But His Grace is Amazing! As the Apostle Paul wrote:

Romans 6:14 - *14 For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.*



Fellowship Breakfast - We all gather together for a big breakfast at 9:00am in the Meech Room of Temple Hall.

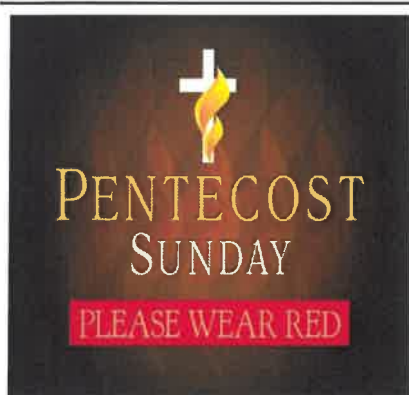
10:00am Sanctuary - Wey and Anne will lead our Renewed Ancient Holy Communion service at 10:00am in the Historic Sanctuary.

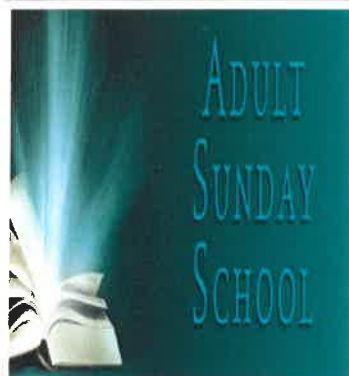

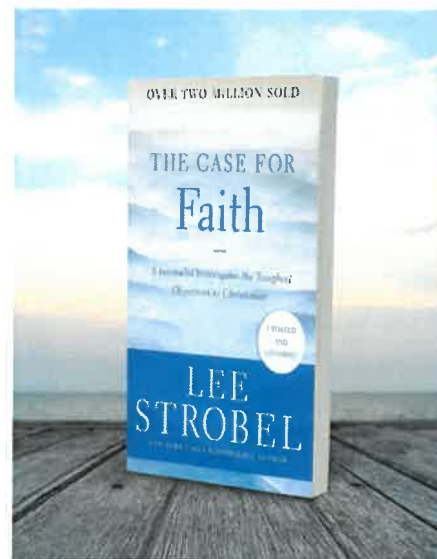


ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

- “I still have doubts, so I can’t be a Christian”

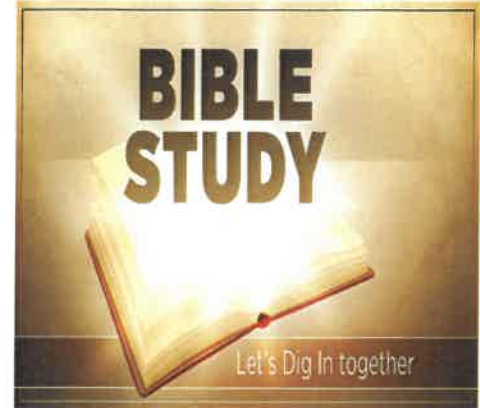

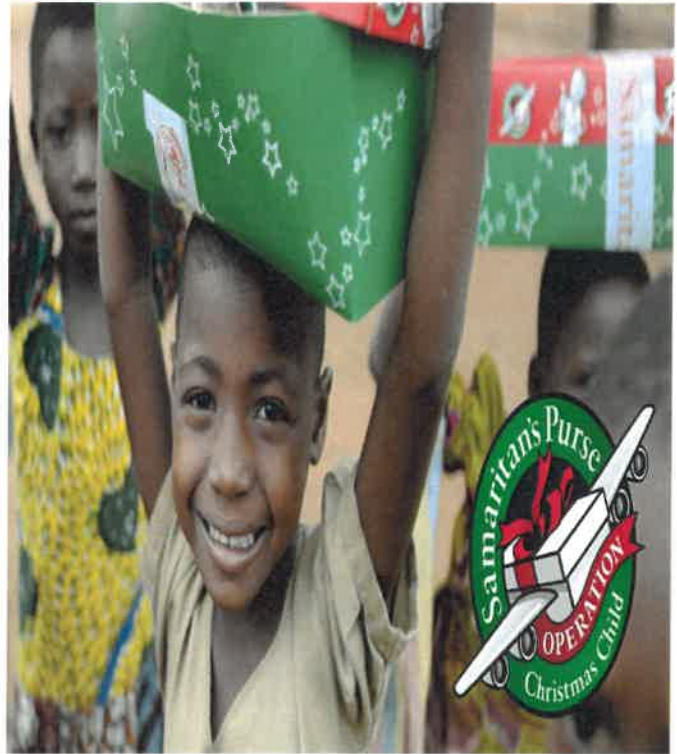

Good things are happening at the Edisto Island Community Clinic!

The clinic has completed its separation from the Good Samaritan Clinic in Columbia and is now a totally independent free clinic. The benefits of this transition are multiple, but simply stated it allows us to move in the direction of providing medical and dental services to our local underserved community based on our local assessment of needs. We now will be governed by a local board made up of current volunteers. These individuals have a clear understanding of the direction the clinic needs to move in to fulfill the mission of “Neighbor Serving Neighbor”. The clinic has recently added new diagnostic equipment, one of which is an EKG machine! Such equipment allows for enhanced diagnostic capabilities within the medical clinic.



We continue to successfully administer the Trinity Church “Smile Fund” as well as the Catholic Charities funding of dentures and partials for those in need. The results of these programs have had a significant impact of many local individuals. The clinic is also in the final phases of establishing a partnership with the Edisto Lions Club to assist in administering their Lions Vision Services program. This will provide for

local qualified residents in need of eye testing and glasses to receive these services. Another new additional service is our Podiatrist (foot doctor) on staff that sees patients and more information or an appointment can be obtained by contacting the clinic. The many specialists with decades of years of experience combined have an immense passion for helping their patients achieve as much ease as possible in their everyday lives.

The future of the Edisto Island Community Clinic is very bright. We now have the ability to be able to navigate our own future and grow the clinic in a manner that best serves the needs of our local community. The clinic days and hours are as followed; dental every Monday by appointment 1pm-4pm and medical every Tuesday and Wednesday 2pm-5pm with walk-ins welcome. All services provided are **free of charge** for Edisto Island residents. The Edisto Island Community Clinic is located at 1589 Highway 174 behind Trinity Church. Edisto Island Library closing for renovation as part of referendum-funded project

The branch will close at 1 p.m. on Saturday, April 27 with renovations taking several months to complete.

CHARLESTON, SC – [Charleston County Public Library](#) (CCPL) is closing the [Edisto Island Library](#), located at 1589 Hwy 174 at Trinity Church on Edisto Island, on **Saturday, April 27 at 1 p.m.** to undergo renovations as part of the ongoing referendum-funded project. The library will receive an interior refresh including new paint and furniture. Once construction is underway, the renovations are expected to take several months to complete.

CCPL plans to open a temporary location adjacent to the current branch offering limited library services during Edisto's closure. The exact opening date for this location will be announced once it is available. Until this temporary location is open, holds at the library will be suspended. Items can be routed to another library by selecting an alternate location when placing a hold online or by calling one of our branches. For patron convenience, the book drop at Edisto Island will remain open until the temporary location is available.

In 2014, Charleston County voters passed a \$108.5 million referendum to build five libraries and update the existing branches. As part of that project, five new libraries have been built throughout the County.

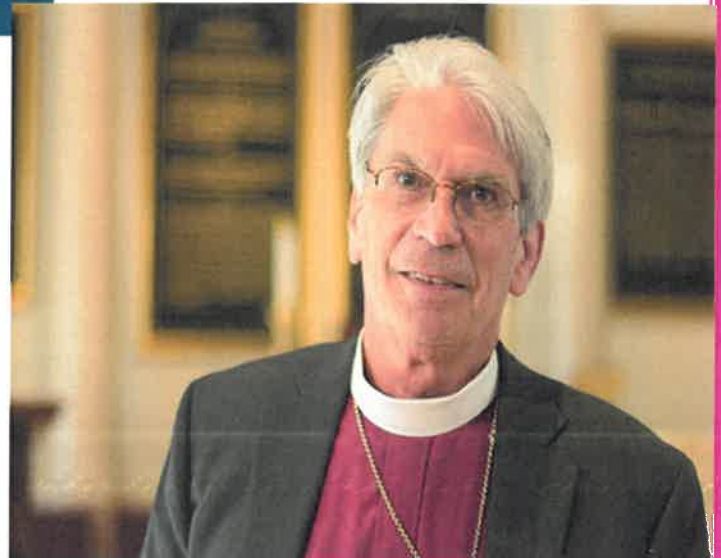
