Dear Children of God.

Matthew 3:1-3 - In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 2 "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." 3 For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight."



Why do we have to read these lessons about John the Baptist? Why do we sing those "hard to sing" Advent hymns!? Because as Anglicans we join together with other Christians around the world in a yearly cycle, a church calendar, a liturgical calendar, with seasons. Yes, but why!?

Why do we follow a liturgical calendar that prescribes these particular scriptures and seasons? Because as Believers, we are followers of Jesus Christ. And so each year, through the scriptures and seasons, we "follow" Jesus through His life, death and resurrection.

Each liturgical calendar year begins with Advent - a season to prepare for his birth and then earthly ministry. So it makes sense that we would read accounts of John the Baptist and his ministry as he "prepared" everyone for the earthly ministry of Jesus. We will also read accounts of Mary and Joseph to prepare for the birth of Jesus.

Each new liturgical year is Trinity's spiritual discipline of following the life, death and resurrection (The Gospel) of our Savior Jesus Christ.







What is Cursillo?

- "Cursillo" is Spanish for "a short course." It is a movement of the church.
 Its purpose is to help those in the church understand their individual callings to be Christian Leaders.
- Cursillo is not designed to meet every spiritual need of every individual or group in the church. It is designed for the participant to "get away" from the daily routine, to listen to the Spirit and live for three days in Christian Community so that through study, worship, fellowship and introspection, one might sense the deeper calling of Christ in their lives to further service in His Church and know how to move forward on this journey.
- The overall goal of Cursillo is the goal of the Church: to bring all to Christ. This is done when informed, trained Christians set out with the support of others having a similar commitment. The Cursillo Weekend takes people who are already Christians and gives them foundational training based on the New Testament Christianity and helps them further discover their own "apostolic calling" based on their individual spiritual gifts!
- But most of all the Cursillo Weekend is about experiencing the unconditional Love of Jesus and Christian brothers and sisters in a way that you probably never have before. It is a taste of "Heaven on earth" and it is very often a life-changing event for participants!

FROM THE GARDEN

Greetings to All. I'm glad to announce that I have returned to the island and couldn't be happier! I'm looking forward to spending a lot of time soaking up the peace and beauty our grounds offer from one season to the next.

Hopefully you've noticed that over the past couple of months, we've had some much needed major pruning done and are clearing the way around the pond, our "Wetlands Oasis". We are planning on more clearing and some type of nature trail. Anything we plant in that area will be native plants. This too will serve as another area for us and our visitors to experience and learn more about the nature that surrounds us. This project will take some time. We will be working on it a little at a time in between our other projects.

Our Gardens were created as a place where visitors could find a sense of peace and hopefully bring them closer to God while there through his miracle of nature. It also serves as an educational garden. People can see what types of plants can grow and thrive on our island and what light is best for those plants to grow in and more importantly, what the deer won't destroy! There are also plants that attract a variety of pollinators and birds. I'm not sure if there's a better place on the island for birdwatching. I've recorded up to 17 types of birds in one sitting through the Merlin App. I highly recommend it if you want to know what birds are coming and going in your own yard or better yet, try it in our gardens early morning and late afternoon!

Now for the big news. At long last, we are working on finishing the plans for phase 3 of the project that The Grounds Beautification Committee planned almost 12 years ago. This phase will be "The Memorial Garden" and along the Memorial Wall. This will be a large project and will take a considerable amount of time and support from the friends and family of Trinity. We hope to have these plans finalized in January at which point we will send out a letter with our vision. The only hint I can give you at this time is that I believe it will surpass anything we've accomplished thus far. The Gardens at Trinity are as lovely as any I've seen. This addition will make them even more enchanting.

During this beautiful season of Christmas, a donation to the "The Gardens at Trinity" is a wonderful way to show someone you are thinking of them and of course memorials for those who have passed. Of course, we will send the recipient a lovely card letting them know of your gift. If your donation is received by December 16th, they will certainly get their card prior to Christmas. If after that time, we will still make every attempt to get the card to them as quickly as possible. While we have nothing specific to offer this Christmas as a gift, we want you to know that 100% of a gift given in honor or memory of someone goes directly to improvements such as plants or some type of garden ornaments.



The packing party was great fun. As I chose what was going in a box I couldn't help but feel the joy when a child realizes the whole box is theirs! All the gifts!










