

Easter - Party for the Resurrection of Christ

Pentecost - Proclaim the Cross and Resurrection of Christ


Ordinary Time - the season of Summer between Pentecost and Advent.

The Church Calendar helps us not be consumed by the World's calendar. We certainly pray for those special days such as Veterans Day, Independence Day, Mother's Day, etc, but we keep our church services and our lives focused on the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

So, on the First Sunday of Advent we will light the Advent Wreath, we will hear about the Second Coming of Christ and we will sing Advent Hymns. **But why?** To help us Prepare our spiritual hearts to celebrate the First Coming of Christ - Christmas. **Oh!!!**

1. What has been your reflection on and participation in the vision of Trinity?

Twenty-four years as a member of Trinity, there have been several ups and downs within the church.

However, Trinity and its congregation have always "held fast" to the Gospel.

That is who we are!

2. Tell us about your faith.

At the young age of 13, I accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior and was baptized in a cold creek in Alabama. My faith has always been strong without question, and I intend to finish that way.

I will answer both questions here:

"Have I been born again?" Must be a fair question since Jesus asked the same of Nicodemus. The question used to bother me since some seem to remember the time and day when they were "born again". I had no clue. Then I considered the other side of the coin. Let me explain. Since Jesus was comparing natural birth with spiritual birth, it must be wise to consider natural birth. I don't remember it either. I couldn't tell you what the doctor and nurses looked like or even the look in my mother's eyes when we first saw each other. So how do I know that I was born? Well I grew up, was educated, had a career, and did all the right things as I matured in the ways of the world.

Now back to spiritual birth. I can't remember it either. I can't tell you how the Holy Spirit delivered me or how it was for the Holy Spirit to see me as "God created me in Christ Jesus". So how do I know I was born again. Well I grew up in the faith, was educated, and matured as I learned to worship Jesus and love my neighbor. I think this is what James must be referring to in his famous chapter (2) on faith and works. Here James describes faith and works as being so close that works not only confirms faith but even originates in faith. With James' idea in mind I don't think it is too hard to answer the question "have you been born again?". It is not that one can remember but rather the Spirit proves it as he moves in you and through you in works of faith. This is why Trinity can be described as such a Faith filled church. You see it everywhere if you look closely. From the kitchen to the clinic, from the classroom to the Sanctuary, from the gardens to the graveyard, from the flower room to the choir room, from the sewing room to the office, there isn't anywhere that isn't filled with faith as people very quietly work as the Body of Christ awaiting His return. It doesn't stop

there either. That's just the beginning. Trinity has grown strong! From here she reaches out to the wider community. We see our people involved with Cursillo, visiting prisons, delivering food or firewood, looking in on neighbors, showing care to widows and others who aren't quite able to care for themselves, delivering care packages world wide, and volunteering in so many more capacities. When Jesus returns will He find Faith (Luke 18:8)? If James has anything to say about it He will at Trinity Edisto. Here we can humbly say we have been "born again" in the Holy Spirit, "Created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10)

1. What has been your reflection on and participation in the vision of Trinity?

(Worship) I have so enjoyed coming to worship on Sundays at Trinity, participating in the liturgy, partaking in communion, and listening to Wey's sermons that carefully relate the Gospel to the ups and downs of everyday life. The beach service is also a favorite way to worship the Lord during the summer months on our beautiful beach of Edisto.

(Know One Another) Jeff and I have been ushers at both the 10:00 service and the beach service. We enjoy greeting our fellow parishioners and bringing forth the gifts of treasure and sacraments. We are both living in Edisto permanently this year and looking forward to participating in more church gatherings. (Serve Others) I have served others for many years in our previous church in Burke, VA as a Sunday School teacher for middle grades. I have also taught and led Vacation Bible School programs in the summer months in Virginia. As a family, we participated in an outreach program for about five years through

FACETS where we prepared and brought meals to the underserved in the Fairfax County area. I have not participated in any service led missions here on Edisto. This is an area of growth for me.

2. Tell us about your faith.

I consider myself richly blessed to have grown up in a loving family of faith. My parents are Catholic and both my brothers and I were raised in the Catholic church. I attended a small Catholic school through the fourth grade and have the sweetest memories of learning about Jesus and what it means to be in relationship with him and have faith. Those foundational experiences in faith have certainly framed my journey this side of heaven. I am a baptized and confirmed Christian, and we raised our children in the Episcopal Church where we were received in 1998. We were received as members of Trinity Church and the Anglican communion in June, 2020. Wey often shares a certain prayer and teaching every Sunday that reach my soul and I have incorporated them into my own faith and daily prayers. The first one is the prayer: "Thank you God for this beautiful day on this Your Island of Edisto." Truly, that small, yet meaningful prayer, reminds me that God brought Jeff and me here to this amazing place that is truly a sanctuary of God's peace and love. The other is a teaching that explains the righteousness of God in a manner that simplifies and glorifies the Trinity. That teaching is (and I am paraphrasing): "The Gospel is the good news of the Cross and Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, where we become the Righteousness of God. Jesus was a substitutional sacrifice. Our sins laid upon him, his righteousness laid upon us." In times of suffering and in times of great joy, I am reminded of these words and of God's love for us.






Altar Guild





Come and participate with us Friday mornings at 10am in the Library where we teach, train, pray, and most of all believe, for God's divine intervention.


