

Three out of four of these young people were connected in church as teenagers but drifted away. ... Thom Rainer led a study and determined that of Americans born between 1974 and 1994, only 4 percent of that population identified themselves as Christians and had trusted Christ alone for salvation." Cemetery Project/Needs for 2023

As the new year begins the Cemetery Committee has two big projects they will be undertaking.

Murdaugh's Tree Service has been engaged to trim the trees in the cemetery. This work is to begin soon. This project is being paid directly out of the Cemetery Fund at a cost of about \$15,000.





We have reserved time with Conservator Joseph Ferrannini of Gravestones Matter for work to clean and restore the headstones in the cemetery and to **teach members how to maintain the gravestones**. The project will begin in January 2023. This work is estimated to cost approximately \$5000. We need volunteer hands to come out and offer labor to help with this project and learn to continue to maintain the

t of Christ going out into the world.






Please bring your old Christmas trees and




Men's Bible Study

What is Cursillo?

- "Cursillo" is Spanish for "a short course." It is a movement of the church.
 Its purpose is to help those in the church understand their individual callings to be Christian Leaders.
- Cursillo is not designed to meet every spiritual need of every individual or group in the church. It is designed for the participant to "get away" from the daily routine, to listen to the Spirit and live for three days in Christian Community so that through study, worship, fellowship and introspection, one might sense the deeper calling of Christ in their lives to further service in His Church and know how to move forward on this journey.
- The overall goal of Cursillo is the goal of the Church: to bring all to Christ. This is done when informed, trained Christians set out with the support of others having a similar commitment. The Cursillo Weekend takes people who are already Christians and gives them foundational training based on the New Testament Christianity and helps them further discover their own "apostolic calling" based on their individual spiritual gifts!
- <u>But most of all</u> the Cursillo Weekend is about experiencing the unconditional Love of Jesus and Christian brothers and sisters in a way that you probably never have before. It is a taste of "Heaven on earth" and it is very often a life-changing event for participants!




