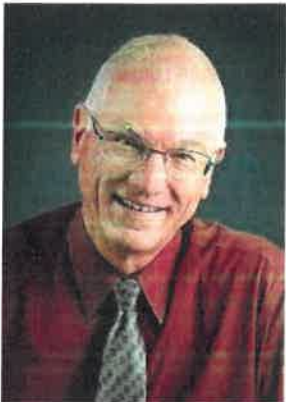

FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Children of God,

Three Types of Leaven/Yeast - WorldView - How someone views the World. What's the problem? What's the solution?

Mark 8:16 - *And he cautioned them, saying, "Watch out; beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and the leaven of Herod."*

1. **Herodians** - Political WorldView - Everything revolves around politics. The Romans are the problem, and the solution is to accommodate them. King Herod, his family and political friends would go along/get along with with Caesar, Pontius Pilate and the Romans.

2. **Pharisees** - Religious WorldView - Everything revolves around religious practices. Immorality and Irreligion are the problem, and the solution is for everyone to obey The Law, as defined by them, the Pharisees and their traditions.

3. **Kingdom of Heaven** - Gospel WorldView - New Covenant of Grace.

Matthew 13:33 - *He told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven that a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened."*

The Problem is law/sin/death. The Solution is grace/righteousness/life.

What is the point of leaven/yeast? It only takes a very small amount mixed up, kneed into the dough and left where? In a warm place. Leaven or yeast is activated by heat.

This is why Jesus uses leaven is a metaphor for WorldView. Everything in the World is fine until when? Until a problem arises, an issue comes up, a conflict occurs and it begins to get **hot!** Then everyone backs up into their WorldView and handles the situation according to their WorldView, what the problem is, what the solution ought to be.

At Trinity we are growing in His grace and learning to use the leaven/yeast of the Kingdom of Heaven as our WorldView, looking to His grace/righteousness/life for the solution.

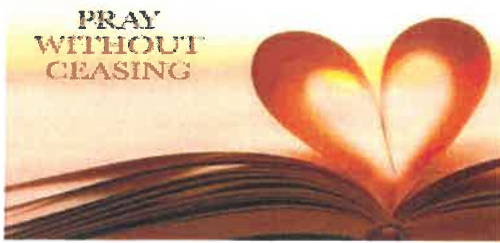

Cursillo is designed for the participant to “get away” from the daily routine, to listen to the Spirit and live for three days in Christian Community so that through study, worship, fellowship and introspection, one might sense the deeper calling of Christ in their lives to further service in His Church and know how to move forward on this journey.

Please make your suggestions to one of the committee members.

“The Nominating Committee shall solicit from the Congregation nominations for the vacancies on the Vestry and shall distribute to the Parish, not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting, a list of nominees. Other floor nominations shall also be allowed if a Member in Good Standing is nominated by two (2) other Members in Good Standing in writing with said Nominee’s name being submitted to the Church office in writing at least two (2) weeks before the Annual Meeting.” (Trinity By-Laws Article VI, Section 6.4)

November 7th - The slate of nominees is presented in the Sunday bulletin.

November 14th -Any additional floor nominations presented in the Sunday bulletin.

December 5th - Annual Meeting and Election at 11:30 a.m., Meech Room.

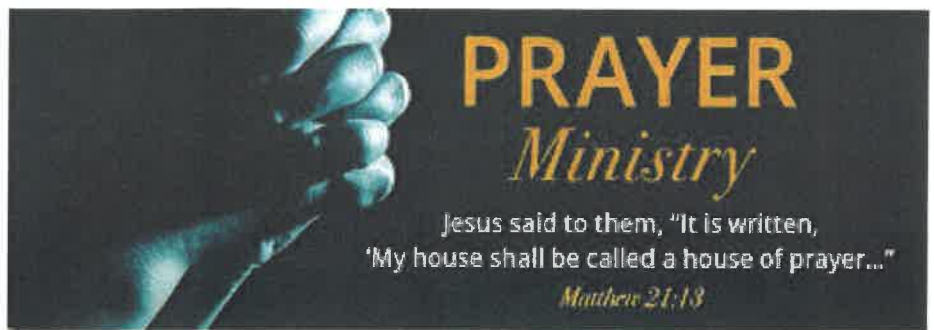
