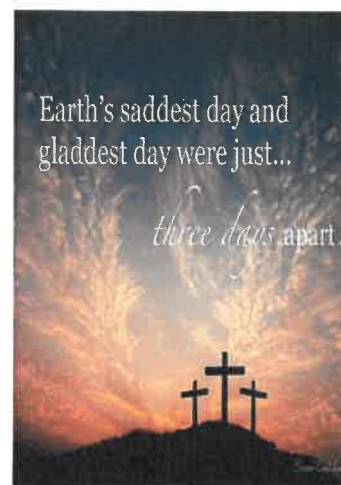

Dear Children of God,

Our God is in a big business, it's called Resurrection/Redemption. He can Resurrect or Redeem anything! The only question is, will we let Him?

This statement is a core value for me, a re-statement of Gospel Truth, a summary statement of how the Gospel works out in our lives. A statement of my experience of walking with Jesus during my lifetime.

No matter how deep the hurt or pain, no matter how big the sin I've committed, no matter how bad the situation looks or feels, He brings Resurrection! He brings Redemption! When I let him, when I re-focus and place my spiritual eyes on Jesus.

So it is with the Coronavirus! No matter how bad this Cronovirus hits us, drags us down, hurts our economy and even takes human life, our Savior Jesus Christ will bring Resurrection!

Now here is a key part of the Obedience of Faith in this Gospel Truth - **What will that Resurrection look like? I don't know.** Just like the Apostles following Jesus, they did not understand when Jesus spoke about His Crucifixion and Resurrection. St Peter even rebuked Jesus in his understanding:

Matthew 16:21 - 21 From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. 22 And Peter took him and began to rebuke him, saying, "God forbid, Lord! This shall never happen to you." 23 But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me; for you are not on the side of God, but of men."

But just because I don't understand exactly what His Resurrection will look like, does not diminish my faith! Why not?? Because of His track record! He did it before, He will do it again!

The Easter Day Text - Matthew 28:1,6 - *Toward dawn on the first day of the week, ... He is not here; for he has risen, as he said. Come see the place where he lay.*

Jesus said He was in the Resurrection Business back then, Jesus is still in the Resurrection Business today! Amen!?

We continue to pray for Provision and Protection over each family of the Family of God at Trinity!

I believe that there is no coincidence that we celebrate and observe the most important occurrence in Christianity during the most inspirational time of the year.

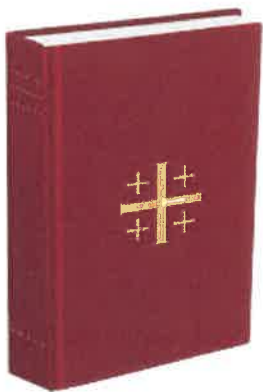

What are the Sacraments and why do we use them?

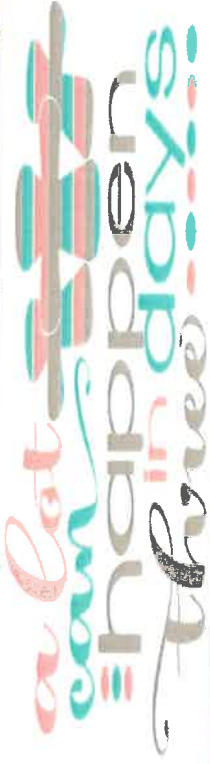
What is the Vision of Trinity?

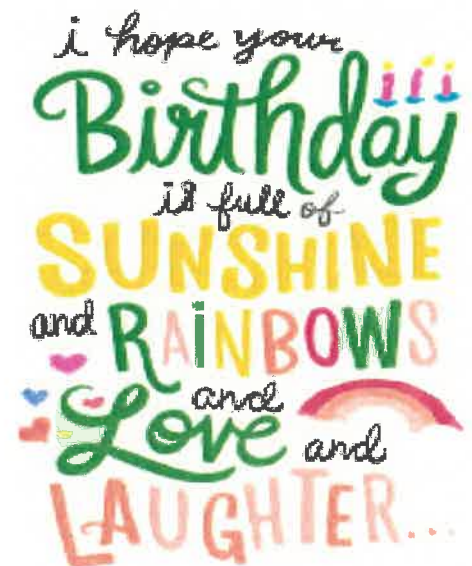
