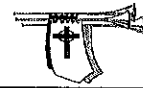

FROM OUR RECTOR . . .



Dear Children of God,

Happy New Year! On the last Sunday of November I wished everyone in church a Happy New Year! Then I explained to the puzzled looks that we had just begun an new liturgical/church calendar year. It was the first Sunday of Advent. The World was focused on Thanksgiving.

Happy Advent! We have entered into the liturgical/church season of preparation for the Christmas Celebration. We are lighting Advent wreathes, singing Advent hymns, reading scriptures calling us to "repent." The World is already celebrating Christmas.

We are an odd people.

Years ago, on a December evening, I gathered with some friends on top of a parking deck in downtown Charleston. Other groups of people were on top of the deck as well. We were watching the Parade of Boats through the Charleston harbor. They were beautifully decorated with multi-colored and blinking lights. Some lights were displayed so that the images of Santa Claus, Christmas Trees and reindeer could be seen. Around the corner came a sailboat with lights draped to appear as a basic Christmas tree. Then in the middle of the tree blinked "Happy Birthday Jesus!" A lady from another group raised her voice and said, "Why do they always have to bring him into these things!" I laughed out loud!

This leads to a great question for all us "odd" people - How do we bring "Him" into a worldly Christmas? Or do we look and act just the same?

Does the Life of Jesus Christ in us make our Christmas cards any different? Our Christmas gifts any different? Our Christmas Parties any different? Our Christmas schedules any different? Or do we look and act just the same?

I don't know the name of the owner of that sailboat years ago but I still remember how his boat was different and he made a simple and fun witness for the birth of our Savior.

Notes from the Choirmaster

We Need Jesus.

Now that Advent is under way, I have the opportunity to re-focus on the message of the gospel. There are worldly distractions all around, and evil is trying to break in. I sometimes feel like a target for evil. In spite of my efforts to be a good Christian, people, things and situations present themselves, and my humanity kicks in. As a human being, it is too easy to rely on my own thinking instead of relying on the teachings of Jesus. When that happens, all of my good intentions become nothing because of my failure to behave in Christ-like ways. Sometimes I might even fool myself into believing my actions are ordained by God, when in reality, they are exactly the opposite of what He would have me do.

We all must help deliver the message of God's unending love for us by first loving Him, then by loving each other. I can do my part by sharing the message through the music. Our Advent praise song is meant to help us do this – we encourage each other to be witnesses by Shouting the Good News of Christ's coming while also singing the prayerful words of O Come, O Come Emmanuel. The words describe Jesus in beautiful metaphors that illustrate how He completely permeates our lives – Emmanuel, Wisdom, Lord of Might, Desire of Nations.

The choral anthems throughout the rest of the season are focused on the Old Testament foretelling of the coming of the Messiah. The message will culminate on Christmas Eve with the birth of Jesus. As a congregation, we will affirm that all of us are called to be messengers of the good news of the Gospel. Christmas day, the choir will lead a service of Lessons and Carols. Hopefully, we will all be more apt to let Him into our lives.

A crèche is a three dimensional artistic representation of the birth of Jesus Christ. The materials, cultures, and designs of the works vary widely. The focus, however, is always on the central figures of Mary, Joseph and the Christ Child. Artists often condense time by bringing together other familiar figures in the story like shepherds, animals, angels, and wise men. St. Francis of Assisi is credited with creating the first Nativity Scene in 1223.
