# FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Children of God,

Happy Thanksgiving! Almost! This is my mother's favorite holiday! Why? All the food, all the family and friends, all the fun, but no fussing about presents! Ha!

In our Daily Office of Morning Prayer we say every morning:

*Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving;  
and raise a loud shout to him with Psalms. (Venite, BCP p.82)*

or

*Enter his gate with thanksgiving;  
go into his courts with praise;  
give thanks to him and call upon his Name. (Jubilate, BCP p. 83)*

Why is it so important for us to be a Thankful People? Thanksgiving combats pride!

"Thank God often and always. Never take God's goodness for granted. Thank God carefully and wonderingly for your continuing privileges and for every experience of His goodness. **Thankfulness is a soil in which pride does not easily grow.**" (emphasis mine) (A Key to Humility, Christian Ministry, by Archbishop Michael Ramsey)

"Thankfulness is a soil in which pride does not easily grow." Brilliant words. It is very easy for us as intelligent, hardworking people to slip into thinking that I am the reason my life is so fine. I have studied hard, I have worked hard, I have accomplished much and so I therefore, because of my effort, now enjoy the finer things in life. Right? But what if I were born in the 1400's, in Tibet, on the side of a Himalayan mountain? Where would I be then? Where would my MBA be? My career? My house? My boat? My club? Ha! Quite a thought.

Now let's step out of the temporal (this world) thought pattern and begin to think of things eternal (the next world). Again it is very easy for us as moral, good, nice people to begin to think of how we deserve our entrance into heaven. Just like the Pharisee who stood in the Temple to pray. He declared his own righteousness by comparing himself to other miserable sinners, like that tax collector, and by acknowledging how he kept his own personal code of piety; a rationalized version of God's commands. (Luke 18:9-14)

But entrance into heaven is not by rationalization but by repentance of sin and thanksgiving for the gift of salvation in the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ! It is only by His sacrifice that we are saved and so we can only say "Thank you!" Which is what we do every Sunday morning; the prayer of consecration for the sacrament of His body and blood is called; *The Great Thanksgiving*. Looking forward to gathering together, to growing as a Thankful People!

## Notes from the Choirmaster

The liturgical calendar does its best to keep us focused each year on the life of Christ. Annually, as liturgical Christians, we celebrate Christ's birth, life, resurrection and ascension. We forever await His second coming as we prepare again to celebrate His first coming. I have to look at how my thinking has changed throughout the last year. I have to ask myself tough questions about how I am responding to the Gospel. I have to do this because I tend to plan my life around things like the beginning of the school year, payday, vacation, etc. instead of focusing on the heavenly things that come from God. This is a very human trait that has been constantly illustrated to us this fall by the readings in Exodus. Over and over again, even though they were on the path of salvation, the Jews' faith was overcome by their earthly needs. They were incapable of believing that God would continue to provide for them, even though He proved Himself to them throughout the entire journey from Egypt. My salvation path is often wrought with the same shortcomings. Other biblical references illustrate this same human attitude, so I can take heart in the fact that I am not alone. I know that God has already forgiven me.

The music we sing serves to remind us of the focus our lives should take. Hymns, psalms and songs of praise play over and over in our minds. Our choral anthems provide a message that, hopefully, survives the Sunday morning experience and stays with us throughout the week. Since Advent begins on November 27th, we will begin singing songs that anticipate the celebration of the first coming of Christ. One place we will need your help is the singing of the Song of Praise at the 11:00 service. It will incorporate 2 verses of "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" into a new song that will hopefully serve to remind us to "Shout the Good News" by making our lives an example of our Christian faith.

On October 20, an "Inside Team" of 31 men, supported by a huge host of cookie bakers, food preparers, and prayer warriors, entered Ridgeland Correctional Institution. We were with the 30 inmates who were participants until late Sunday afternoon, the 23<sup>rd</sup>. On this weekend amazing things happened. Men who professed to be Christians came into a much deeper relationship with The Living God. Men who did not know God were overjoyed by the Christian Love, which permeated our meetings. 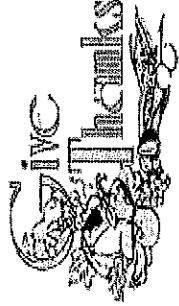

# Trinity Items of Note

## 2012 Vestry Nominee Q&A

Congratulations to Bud Doty, Pat Neumann, and Conrad Zimmerman on their nomination to the Vestry! Only adult members who are "communicants in good standing" are eligible for nomination. Communicants in Good Standing are those "who for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God." (Title I, Canon 17, Sec. 3) In addition to active membership, participation in a small group and the monthly vestry meeting, each vestry member is asked to help coordinate a particular area of our life together as the Family of God source of information.

Each of these nominees was asked the same two questions. Here are their responses:

**Q: What has been your reflection and participation in the vision of Trinity?**

**A:**

[Bud Doty] Trinity's vision statement is a work in progress and needs the entire Trinity family to participate in its continuance.

[Patricia Neumann] I had the opportunity to participate in some of the sessions that resulted in the development of Trinity's vision a few years ago. The end result of that process was an extraordinarily positive statement which, when followed by our church family, should enable us to draw closer to God and to understand and realize His plans for us. Personally, I try to incorporate our vision into all aspects of my daily life.

The vision statement is broad and encompasses all of the activities in which we are and can be involved at Trinity. I have been the chairman of the *Pon Top Edisto* cookbook committee and have served on the Flower Guild in the past. I am currently undergoing the period of discernment and preparation necessary for admission into the Maria Temple Chapter of the Order of the Daughters of the King. I am blessed and honored to serve as a Chalice Bearer at Trinity.

[Conrad Zimmerman] I've been a member of Trinity for 22 years and know that through the practice of faith by our members we are living our vision. Our church community sustains us each with God's love and offers many opportunities to serve him. We are disciples of Christ and through our works we witness so others may follow.
