FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Children of God,

Afterward Moses and Aaron went and said to Pharaoh, "Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, 'Let my people go, that they may hold a feast to me in the wilderness.'" (Exodus 5:1)

In our Sunday Lectionary we have been reading through Exodus which is a beautiful and rich revelation of what "Salvation" means. The basic plot line of Exodus is how the LORD miraculously liberates the Children of Israel from slavery in Egypt and by the end of Exodus they are free to worship him in the Tabernacle. Exodus begins with serving the Egyptians as slaves and it ends in the freedom to serve and worship the Living God.

Our Salvation includes the same dynamic. We get caught up in looking to something or someone else to give us our joy, our security, our significance. This can be anything. From drugs and alcohol to our job, our family, our bank account, our achievements, our hobbies, you name it. And then that something or someone enslaves us. It begins to rule our lives, becomes the focus of our lives.

The Salvation for the Children of Israel was then worked out in two parts; dramatic release of the people from slavery and the long process of taking the slavery out of the people.

There was the Passover Lamb and the Red Sea and then the forty years of wilderness wanderings. The Passover Lamb and Red Sea correspond with our justification; when we repent and believe in the sacrifice of our Savior Jesus on the cross for our sins (Passover Lamb) and His resurrection offering us new life (the Red Sea) we are saved! The Children of Israel are taken out of slavery!

The second part, the Wilderness Wanderings, correspond to our sanctification; when we begin to walk in this new life of faith with our Lord Jesus by the power of His Holy Spirit – the long process of taking the slavery out of the Children of Israel. These are the stories of how the Children of Israel murmured, grumbled, found fault and even built the golden calf in the wilderness. It was a long process of Wilderness Training for the Children of Israel, and us, so that we may learn to worship the LORD God.

What someone or something has gained your attention, your energy, your focus, your time and resources? Anything that we "worship" becomes our master and it begins to enslave us. The story of Exodus is the prototypical story of how "Salvation" works, of how our Savior Jesus Christ has come to save us, to liberate us so that we might be free to worship Him.

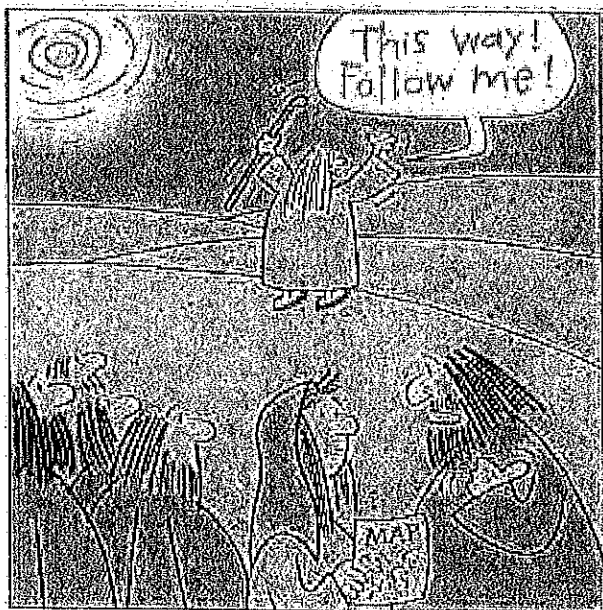

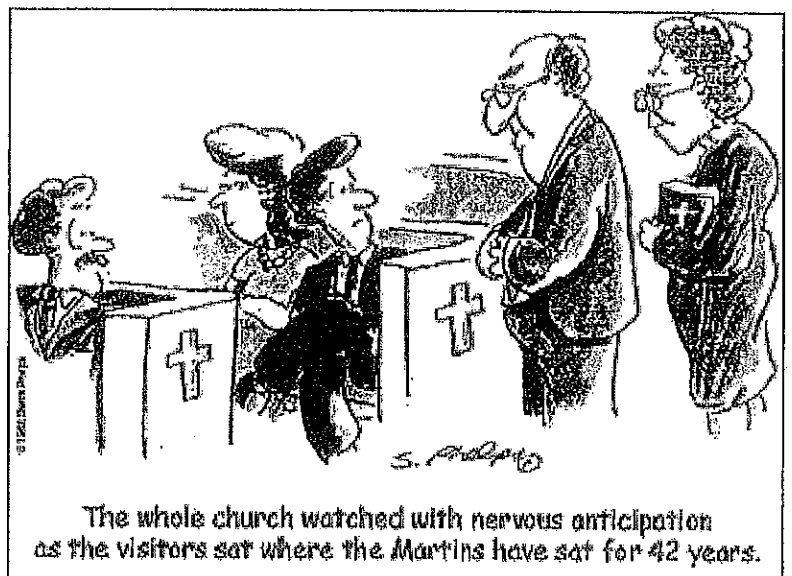

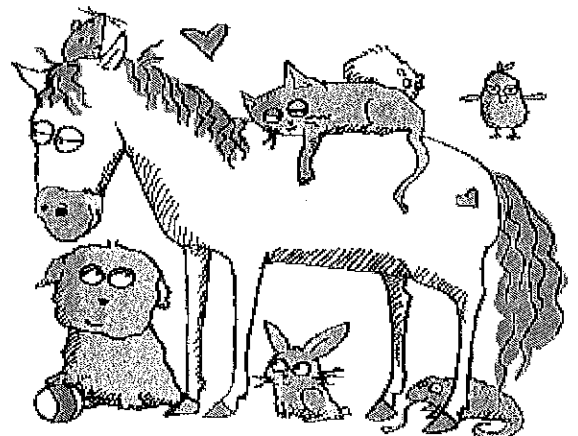
